ROOSEVELT PARK RIBBON CUTTING IS OCT. 4

A ribbon cutting ceremony celebrating the transition of the former Roosevelt School playground to Roosevelt Park will be at 4:30 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 4. The park preserves open green space, celebrates the core neighborhood's history, and includes a stage for performances, playground, drinking fountain, benches, trash receptacles, and landscaping.

Friends of Roosevelt Park played a significant role in park development, raising nearly \$55,000 towards the project.

The event will include the ribbon cutting followed by a neighborhood concert and community potluck. The entire Ames community is invited. The park is located at Ninth Street and Roosevelt Avenue.

ELECTRIC SERVICES CONDUCTING TREE INVENTORY

The Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) has been discovered in Story Country, and its migration to Ames is inevitable. EAB is an invasive beetle that kills ash trees.

City of Ames Electric Services is concerned about ash trees located near power lines and the potential for unstable trees to disrupt your electric service and create power outages. The City will soon begin to inventory all trees near electric lines and power poles. In order to gather tree information, City of Ames employees may require access to utility easements located on private property.

Throughout the fall, you may see City employees collecting tree inventory data in your neighborhood. Our employees will be identifiable by City of Ames clothing. They will quickly and professionally gather the information required and leave the area undisturbed.
