The Inis Grove Neighborhood Association encompasses approximately 100 homes around Inis Grove Park along Duff Avenue, generally north of 22nd Street. The neighborhood is completely residential, with most homes constructed in the mid- to late-1960s.

"We are a fairly diverse neighborhood, with young families as well as retirees," said Martin Edelson, spokesperson for the Inis Grove NA. "Organizing the Inis Grove NA has provided many in the neighborhood with increased opportunities to meet our neighbors and discuss issues of common interest."

Neighbors are learning how to engage with city government by attending meetings, reading online postings, and by speaking to their Council representative.
