### START A NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION

The City of Ames Neighborhood Association list was updated this summer to reflect only those associations that are currently active. Unfortunately, several associations have become inactive.

Neighborhood Associations are important. They build stronger communities by organizing neighborhood improvement projects, encouraging the discussion of ideas which affect the neighborhood, and promoting friendship and fostering a sense of concern and caring among people in the neighborhood. Depending on the needs of an area, the reason for forming an association may vary. Sometimes it is as simple as adjusting the boundaries of an association to keep it active and the momentum going.

A neighborhood association can benefit an area directly and the community at large by fostering communication with government



officials, businesses, and other groups. These connections help create partnerships within a neighborhood and aid in a strong neighborhood network. Please consider starting an association or re-activating an existing one.
