### **Council Passes Rental Cap Ordinance**

At its May 22 meeting, the City Council passed an ordinance that limits the percentage of rental properties in certain neighborhoods to 25 percent. Properties in any of the Rental Concentration Cap Neighborhoods can be registered as a rental property provided the neighborhood they are located in is below 25 percent rental density.

The Rental Concentration Cap Neighborhoods and their current rental density percentage are as follows:

- College Creek/Old Ames Middle School (CCOAMS) (55%)
- Colonial Village (30%)
- Edwards (23%)
- Oak-Riverside (31%)
- Oak-Wood-Forest (32%)
- South Campus Neighborhood-North (SCAN-North) (36%)
- · Westside (60%)

The City Council will continue to discuss different options that would allow property owners in certain circumstances to apply for a hardship to allow them to register the property as rental.
