### NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATIONS UPDATE

The Ames City Council hosted a neighborhood summit in October 2018. Based on discussion at the summit and at the Council's direction, City staff emailed a survey to active neighborhood associations about how they function and what topics are of interest to their neighborhood. Neighborhood associations were also invited to a meeting on May 9 to discuss existing neighborhood programming and where the program could go in the future.

re-establishing a neighborhood association that has become inactive, you are encouraged to take the survey at www.CityOfAmes.org/neighborhoods. Once more information is gathered, staff will bring proposed changes to City Council for discussion.

#### HEALTHY LIFE CENTER BOND REFERENDUM IS SEPT. 10

Ames residents have the opportunity to build a one-of-a-kind Healthy Life Center. The complex will make healthy living accessible and achievable for all people regardless of age and socio-economic status. Six community partners, along with donations, will fund \$20 million (41 percent) of the project cost. The balance, approximately \$29 million (59 percent), would be financed through a bond referendum on Tuesday, Sept. 10.

The Healthy Life Center will offer a holistic, intergenerational approach to wellness—"Live Well. Be Well." The facility would include a warm-water indoor aquatic center, indoor walking

track and gymnasium, participation kitchen for cooking and nutrition classes, meeting rooms, and more.
