LIVING THE DREAM: CLASS ALLOWS PARTICPANTS TO DRIVE ZAMBONI

Have you always dreamed of being in the driver's seat of the ice resurfacer (Zamboni) at the Ames/ISU Ice Arena? Now your dream can become a reality.

Ames Parks and Recreation is offering the "Drive the Zamboni Experience" in the form of a two-hour class. Each participant will first get background and insight into ice maintenance through a classroom session. This will be followed by climbing aboard the Zamboni for a spin around the ice.

This first-time ever opportunity will be held on Saturday, March 12, from 5 to 7 p.m. at the Ames/ISU Ice Arena. The cost is \$95. Participants must be age 18 or older with a valid driver's license.

Spring Hydrant Flushing Begins in March

The Ames Public Works Department plans to begin flushing rust from water mains beginning Wednesday, March 23, weather permitting, and continuing for approximately two weeks. Each year, this program provides Ames residents with the safest and highest quality water possible.

Flushing serves the following purposes:

- Dislodges and removes mineral deposits and sediments from the water mains
- Verifies the proper operation of fire hydrants and valves
- Helps identify weaknesses in the water system



 Checks for closed valves and weak flows in the water system

During the flushing process, Ames residents may experience rust in the water, even when crews are not working in the immediate area.

To avoid rust, follow these tips:

- Turn on cold water first to check for rust. This avoids drawing it into your hot water heater.
- If the water looks rusty, run the tap for one to two minutes until it clears.

If rust discolors clothing in a washing machine, rust remover is available at the City Hall information desk, 515 Clark Ave.; Ames fire stations; the Water Treatment Plant, 1800 E. 13th St.; or by calling 515.239.5550.

Q: How does the City of Ames help businesses become more sustainable?

A: Great question! Ames Electric Services, in cooperation with the Office of Sustainability at Iowa State University, administers a program in Ames aimed at helping businesses become more aware of sustainability issues and formulate a plan to achieve improvement. Businesses are encouraged to become sustainability leaders through participation in the "Smart Business Challenge."

The Smart Business Challenge began with the citywide sesquicentennial celebration in 2014 and has continued. Ames Electric Services continues to reach out to businesses to participate in this comprehensive program. The goal is to support sustainable practices in Ames through special opportunities including energy and water conservation, transportation efficiency, waste reduction, improved indoor and outdoor environmental quality, carbon footprint reduction, and community engagement.

Every January, Ames Electric Services hosts an annual Smart Business Challenge Recognition Luncheon which acknowledges businesses who've made strides in energy conservation. The event provides information about other City conservation programs and includes an energy conservation

keynote speaker. The most recent event focused on the City's efforts at becoming a low carbon community through developing a community-wide Climate Action Plan.

Businesses involved with the Smart Business Challenge are recognized for the work they are already doing and encouraged



to attain greater levels of sustainability. The result is a better customer experience and the implementation of a business energy plan that saves money while helping the environment.

Business leaders may find it difficult to invest in conservation and sustainability when focusing on growing the business. Participating in the Smart Business Challenge is free and includes an energy audit and the assignment of a dedicated team to help the business through the process.
