

## CONSIDERING LANDSCAPE IMPROVEMENTS? WE'VE GOT A REBATE FOR THAT!

Spring is the season to start planning gardens and consider landscaping options. The City of Ames offers incentives to make environmentally friendly choices when implementing those plans. There are several rebates available that encourage harvesting rainfall, planting native flowers, aerating lawns, reducing stormwater runoff, and composting. These options can not only beautify your property, they can also save money.

The City's SmartWatersheds rebate program provides a cost share for eligible practices. Currently native trees, native

landscaping, soil and lawn quality restoration, rain gardens, rain barrels, and composters are eligible. These solutions reduce stormwater

runoff into the city storm sewer system and improve the water quality and the health of our waterways and lakes. As an added bonus, many of the initiatives can reduce the amount of outside water needed and that can lower utility bills!

Rebates are available whenever you're ready to make the commitment. For example, spring is a great time for planting native trees but after the heat of summer passes, autumn offers another opportunity. Each program has specific rebate eligibility requirements, so make sure you check the website for details.


## SAVE THE DATE: RUMMAGE RAMPAGE RETURNS

Mark your calendars for the seventh annual Rummage RAMPage, which begins with donations drop-off on Friday, July 26, and continues through Saturday, Aug. 3, as the final day of shopping.

The City of Ames, in partnership with the ISU Office of Sustainability and local non-profit organizations, holds this community-wide garage sale to keep reusable items out of the waste stream. Items are donated for sale, and volunteers from local non-profit groups help run the sale and share in any profit. The event is held at the Ames Intermodal Parking Ramp, 129 Hayward Ave.

"With the large number of lease changeovers at the end of July, this event provides an alternative for residents who are not only looking to dispose of household goods, but also acquire still-usable items that might be thrown in the trash or randomly dumped otherwise," said Resource Recovery Plant Superintendent Bill Schmitt.

Rummage RAMPage grew from the desire to repurpose items often left on the curb during the annual move



In 2023, this event diverted 154,843 pounds of furniture and housewares from the landfill and raised more than \$62,000 for local non-profit agencies.
